Staff Development Days – Building Excellence in Inclusive Education

On Wednesday and Thursday of Week 1 staff engaged in two days of rich professional learning provided by Jenny Murray - Director of Education, Lynne Hugginson - Learning and Wellbeing Co-ordinator, Carol McMahon – Learning and Leadership Co-ordinator, Paula Madigan - Curriculum Advisor, Sharon Gale - Literacy and Numeracy Strategy Advisor and myself.

This professional learning included putting a lens on Inclusive Practices Policy, 6 Key elements of a quality reading program, Collective Efficacy, Classroom Management, the School Plan, mandatory training and collaborative planning. Teacher Professional Learning is critical to building the capacity of staff to provide the best education for our students. As part of NSW Department of Education, our goal is to ensure every student, every teacher, every leader and every school improves every year.

School Staffing

Our first few weeks back at school have been a busy and exciting time as students reunited with their friends, met their new teachers and settled into their learning. Along with our new students, we also welcome several new teachers to the school;

Ms Lana Ashworth, Mrs Kara McMenemy, Miss Holly De With, Mrs Shelley Hordern and Mr Robert Kealy will join our team of K - 6 classroom teachers. Mrs Fiona Keenan will join our district resource team as Hub and Spoke teacher.

The school has received significant funds under the State's COVID Intensive Learning Support Program to provide targeted intervention. We welcome Mrs Ashlee Keating, Mrs Tanya Gray and Mrs Shelley Horden who will be working closely with teachers to deliver tailored small group instruction across K-6. We also welcome back Ms Margaret O'Brien who was on leave last year.

Classes 2021

This year we have a focus on personalised learning and to support this the school has funded two additional classroom teachers to allow classes to be smaller. The average class size across the school this year is 22.

Students have been placed in classes. Many factors were considered when forming classes and teachers spent a great deal of time and care in this process. We have enrolled a number of new students across K-6. However, we will only need to make a slight adjustment to grade 4 and 5 classes. We will be forming a Year 4/5 class. Parents and carers of the 19 students who will be changing classes will be contacted by the Assistant Principals.

 - Ensure 'School bus' is turned on. Turn off other modes if you only want to see school buses (this applies to the Opal Travel app as well). Reduce 'Connecting with public transport walking time' from 20 minutes to 5 minutes.
