
#### 1 JADE - MS KING


1 Jade has been learning about how counting sequences have patterns.

Students learned that they had to identify a rule in a pattern to determine what would come next.



A Quick Guide to Road **Rules in School Zones** 

HELPING OUR KIDS STAY SAFE IN SCHOOL ZONES

**Driving in school zones is** a serious responsibility and here's how to stay aware to make sure you're following the road rules.



#### NO STOPPING

No Stopping at all on any length of road to which a No Stopping sign applies.

#### **BUSZONE**

Youare not allowed to stop your vehicle in a Bus Zoneatall. Only public buses can stop here.
