### RINGWORM

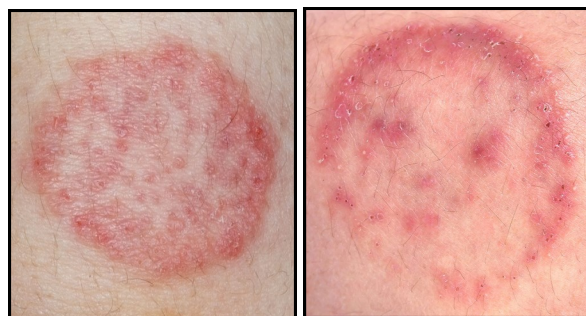
We have had several cases of ringworm reported in recent weeks.

Ringworm is the name for a tinea fungal infection when it occurs on the scalp or body. Despite the name, no worms are involved.

Fungal infections on most areas of skin appear as a flat, spreading, ring-shaped scaly patch. The outer edge is usually reddish. The area often contains fluid, including pus, but may be dry and scaly, or moist and crusted.

The germ spreads by direct skin contact or by touching contaminated clothing or other articles, infected animals or contaminated soil. Children are infectious as long as the condition persists or until treatment has started. Good hand hygiene reduces the risk of spread.

**Children should be excluded until the day after anti-fungal treatment has started and have the area covered while at school.**

Your booking requests will be confirmed by email. Please check that you receive the confirmation from us within 2 working days of submitting. The minimum notice required to cancel a Vacation Care booking where no charge will apply is 1:30pm the working day before your booking. Please note that weekends and Public Holidays are Non Working Days. All bookings not cancelled by this time will be charged at full fee.

**FEES:** Depending on the Child Care Subsidy (CCS) and activity hours a parent is entitled too, the out of pocket costs to parents can range from a few dollars to the full rate shown below. To find out more about the Child Care Subsidy please visit at <https://www.education.gov.au/ChildCarePackage>. The table below shows the full fee with no Child Care Subsidy along with an example of the out of pocket expense where the highest rate of Child Care Subsidy is applied.

**Your fee will vary depending on your own CCS rate and activity hours you receive.** Unlike some providers, Community OOSH Services strive to put you and your children first, providing the highest quality care for the lowest possible price. Please note excursions are at an additional cost and vary depending on the excursion. The cost on each excursion are shown on the next page and these costs will have your CCS % applied to substantially reduce excursion costs.

<b>IMPORTANT NOTE ON CHANGES TO HOLIDAY BOOKINGS</b> We have always released our programs 4 weeks out from the school holidays. Over the last twelve months we have had seen centres "Book Out" completely within days of going online in a practice where people are blankly blocking out every day because they are unsure of their actual childcare needs. When they do find out weeks later, they cancel the days they don't need at the last minute leaving empty places at centres. However, in that time period, the people with real needs have been locked out, moved to other centres or have desperately made other arrangements for care when they could have filled those empty places at with genuine bookings at their home centre. Whilst we have put several structures in place in recent holiday periods (i.e. one-week early release booking for existing clients and two week out warning notifications to readjust bookings to allow the opening up of days) this has done little to fix the main problem. So, somewhat reluctantly, we are now having to resort to becoming like everyone else. <b>From Monday 21st August we have implemented a mandatory 2-week notice of Cancellation period for our Vacation Care programs. This means that you will be charged your normal gap fee if you cancel care without 2-weeks' notice.</b> We hope that this will create a pattern of booking and cancellation behaviour that allows all families the chance to access the care they need, in an appropriate and timely manner, at the centre where the children feel most at home.				
<b>DAVE'S BAYE – OVERTHINKING, OVER REGULATING AND NAVEL GAZING!</b> As we speak, I am mentally recovering from winning the battle with our insurance company to stop them from trying to ban us from using our jumping castles!(amongst other things, it was a knee jerk reaction to the horrific Tasmanian incident in December 2021) They had to be convinced that mini-cyclones don't occur "inside" our buildings. In a similar vein, and in an effort to prove their relevance, our own regulatory authority, the "Early Childhood Education and Care Directorate, have bounced back from their two and a half year Covid induced sojourn by introducing a host of new rules, regulations and "best practices" to add to the irrelevant ones that already exist! Winning these battles is getting harder! We still believe <b>"In a world gone mad with rules and regulations, we help kids, be kids!"</b>

## **Working with Children Checks**

All Team Managers and Coaches of players under the age of 18 are required to supply their Working with Children Information before commencing the season. Please go to [www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au](http://www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au) for more information.

## **Game Fees**

Each player will be required to pay \$140 to play in the competition.

**We have a NO PAY, NO PLAY policy. ALL competition fees are due Week 4 of competition.**

Please note: Individual players who were non-financial from the previous competition with monies owing (outside of any instalment arrangements) will not be able to play at all, until this debt has been paid. This includes any monies owing for Representative or other Coffs Harbour Basketball programs.

## **Forfeit Fees**

If your team forfeits without providing CHBA 48 hours notice, you will be required to pay an \$85 forfeit fee to re-enter the competition.

## **Uniforms**

Players need to be in full club uniform. Club reversible singlet and shorts. Shorts must not have pockets.

## **Team Regulations & Nominations**

Teams must have a minimum of 7 players per team.

Teams can only have a maximum of four representative players per team. This is limited to, two 2023 rep team division one representative players. If the team has no division one players, then there is a limit of four division two players. This is to make the competition more competitive and have less forfeits.

If you feel your team is unable to meet these requirements please contact your club delegate to discuss the situation.
